## Note from the Principal, Mr. Mosby

Hello RRE families:

Spring is here and with that comes our April showers and severe weather. I am including a reminder of what our new severe weather practice is with Covid so PLEASE review prior to our next lightning storm.

Severe Weather and Lightning (NEW COVID LIGHTNING PROCEDURES) In situations where the weather is severe or the threat of lightning exists, Rock Ridge will hang a yellow flag on the front flagpole. Teachers will hold children in their classrooms.

Parents need to park and come to the students' respective entrances/exits IF you desire to acquire your student prior to the severe weather ending. Parents can sign their students out at different exits around the building, depending on grade level.

- Ms. Poalillo (Kindi), Pre-school and SSN will be checked out at their outside classroom doors.
- AN, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade will be checked out at the playground doors.
- Gilbert & Grider (Kindi) along with 1st grade will check out at the 1st grade door (southside doors)
- 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade will check out of the gym doors by the parking lot. 4<sup>th</sup> grade will check out of their classroom doors in the mobiles.

Parents should provide the classroom teacher with an emergency release form that indicates alternate adults that can pick up students in the event of emergency/severe weather. Rock Ridge students will not be released to middle or high school students during severe weather dismissals. Buses will be held until safe to transport students. Walkers and bikers will be released once the severe weather has passed.

If you have any questions please contact the office so that we can further explain the new safety procedures.

We had our first virtual student lead conferences recently and the feedback was that it was well received and a success. Thank you all for your understanding and working with staff so that your students could celebrate their success.

I want to give a big thank you to Lydia Goodland, Paula Graham and Alexous Montoya who served on the PTO board for the past six, two and two years, respectively. Thank you for your service, dedication and support of Rock Ridge. Under your watch we have grown as a community and a school for the betterment of our students. I look forward to working with the new board in the coming years.

In closing our last day of school for students is May 25<sup>th</sup>. Teachers will be in the building on May 26<sup>th</sup> to close out reports and prepare classrooms for summer cleaning. After this date no one will have access to the building for the rest of the summer as they begin the Bond construction improvements for Rock Ridge. This is exciting because we will be returning to Rock Ridge in the fall to a new roof, HVAC system, some new floors, cabinets and more. Spring time means baseball! Several of Mr. Rasavage's 5<sup>th</sup> grade students have been enjoying baseball during recess.








## **New Staff Member Spotlight**



## **Tdap Letter for incoming 6<sup>th</sup> graders**



To: Parents/Guardians of students enrolled in Colorado schools

From: Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Immunization Branch

RE: Tdap vaccine required at 6 grade entry

January 9, 2021

Dear Parent/Guardian.

In Colorado, students entering 6 grade are required to get the tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis (Tdap) vaccine before they start school. See www.colorado.gov/pacific/cdphe/schoolrequiredvaccines.

Tetanus is a rare, non-contagious disease that can cause painful muscle tightening and stiffness; people can get tetanus through a cut or wound. Diphtheria is a rare, contagious disease that can cause breathing problems, heart failure, and other serious issues. Pertussis, or whooping cough, is a very contagious disease that can cause severe coughing spells, difficulty breathing, and other serious issues, especially in infants, toddlers, and other people who have weakened immune systems. Adolescents who get pertussis can be sick for up to three months.

A Tdap dose administered at 10 years of age counts as the adolescent Tdap dose and meets Colorado's 6th grade Tdap requirement: <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/hcp/acip-recs/vacc-specific/dtap.html">https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/hcp/acip-recs/vacc-specific/dtap.html</a>

If your student does not receive Tdap vaccine and does not meet Colorado's 6<sup>th</sup> grade Tdap requirement, a Certificate of Medical Exemption or an annual Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption must be submitted to the school: <a href="www.colorado.gov/vaccineexemption">www.colorado.gov/vaccineexemption</a>. This will assure that your student is in compliance with the Colorado school immunization law and be allowed to attend school.





#### **International Baccalaureate**

Each month we focus on an IB Learner Profile and *Reflective* is our focus for the month of April.

Students who are Reflective know what their strengths and areas to improve are. They try to think about these things, and they make changes where they can. They give thoughtful consideration to their own learning and consider their personal strengths and weaknesses in a constructive manner.

#### How can parents help to develop students who are Reflective at home?

Spend some time reviewing your child's report card with them. They should have the opportunity to look at this document and consider it as well. Discuss it with them and truly consider their thoughts on their strengths and areas for improvement.

Consider the goals that your child could set for the next term. Make a list not only of the goals, but of specific actions that can be taken to achieve these goals. You might want to list action that your child will take independently as well as action parents will take to support them. For example, if one of the goals your child sets for herself is to improve her writing, her action might be to keep a journal and write in it for at least 10 minutes each night. As a parent, you might decide that the two of you will participate in shared writing, for 30 minutes each week and produce a book of narratives together.

Consider your child's Learner Profile Self-Assessment that came home as part of the report card. This is a significant section of the formal report card that is often overlooked. Ask your child to clarify this part of the report card for you and explain why she rated her performance the way she did. Can she give an example of an area in which she is particularly strong? How does she know that this is a strong point? Can she set specific goals for improvement in other areas?
