**Gym: 3rd-6th Grade:** We will begin a unit called "Project Fit America". Students will participate in cardiovascular activities where they earn cups to create/build structures during class. We will focus on teamwork, cooperation, and communication during the unit.

**K-2nd:** We will begin a throwing and catching unit. Students will learn proper throwing form, and a few strategies to successfully catch.

**Art:** Hello Parents, your student's Original Works packets were sent out last week. Please have your child return them to school if you would like to purchase them. The last day to order is October 10th so please send them in either before or on the 10th! Also, don't forget a portion of the proceeds gets put into the art department to buy more art supplies!

Music: In Music class, we are continuing our exploration of musical systems through the IB Transdisciplinary theme, "How We Organize Ourselves". K-2 is working on rhythms and singing songs, grades 3-4 are working on playing Ukuleles, reading the treble clef and strumming beats and rhythms; 5th grade is learning how to read music and play the guitar; 6th grade is learning how to read the grand staff and play songs on the piano.

Join or Rock Ridge Choir at Mesa Middle School on Tuesday, October 29th at 6:00 pm. We will be performing with our feeder schools, Mesa and Douglas Co High School Choirs! **Spanish:** Hispanic Heritage Month is from September 15 - October 15. Members of the Spanish Club have researched famous Hispanic people and have presented their research to the school during morning announcements. We have learned about famous artists, filmmakers, astronauts, dancers, and singers who are all Hispanic.

During October, students in Spanish class will be learning to identify the different parts of the body in Spanish, as well as learning descriptive adjectives. They will be describing themselves, family members or other people.

Rock Ridge is proud to present the Rock Ridge Rockets Before and After School program (Rockets B.A.S.E. for short). You can be a positive role model and provide an extra set of eyes and ears for our students' safety by:


