Normally, we would be honoring you with a volunteer breakfast. I look forward to this





International Baccalaureate

Each month we focus on an IB Learner Profile and *Thinkers* is our focus for the month of **May.**

- These students exercise initiative in applying thinking skills critically and creatively to make sound decisions and to solve complex problems.
- Students who are thinkers work to solve problems. They can imagine many solutions to a question or challenge. Thinkers make good decisions and can predict the outcomes of their actions. They think creatively and critically.

How can parents help to develop students who are Thinkers at home?

- Encourage your child to try to think of solutions to problems independently.
- Pose different real-life problems and questions to your child:
 - "I'm not sure how to arrange the glasses so they can all fit in the cupboard."
 - ♦ "I wonder how much the groceries in the cart will cost... how can we make an estimate?"
 - "We need enough cookies for the 20 people in your class. What kind of changes should we make to our recipe?"
- Ask your children questions when they are working on a problem:
 - "Do you have any ideas about how we might begin?"
 - ♦ "How can we do this differently?"
 - ♦ "I had never thought of that. Tell me more about it."
 - ♦ "What other ways can we show that?"
 - ♦ "Why do you think that?"
 - ♦ "How did you figure that out?"



Both books allow us to reflect on how the characters changed. Each character goes through a lesson that helps them to develop an awareness of themselves, how they can help themselves to grow and improve and move onwards and upwards.

The Girl Who Never Made A Mistake is great at illustrating how perfectionism can be debilitating and that we absolutely can use mistakes positively for our own learning.

Ish is a study of how we can harness our creativity and blossom without having to have everything exactly perfect. It actually questions, what is perfect anyway. I love it!
